


EMERGENCY MEDICAL SERVICES STATUS


9-1-1 ambulance transport volume continue to increase over the last 30 days. Volume is approaching normal (pre-COVID) levels but most of the increase has occurred in the last two (2) weeks (Updated 12/17/20).



Non-emergency ambulance transports continue to decline. Transport volume is averaging about 20-25% below normal (pre-COVID) levels overall (Updated 12/17/20).



Primary Impressions of Cold/Flu/ILI by 9-1-1 EMS providers have leveled off the last couple days, but remain > 10% of all 9-1-1 transports (Updated 12/17/20).





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Ambulance Patient Offload Time (APOT) is defined as the time the ambulance arrives at the receiving destination (wheels stop) to the time that the ambulance crew physically transfers the patient to the ED gurney.
 Last 24 hours: Current Average APOT is: 23m02s / Current 90th Percentile APOT is: 50m38s

The chart below displays a daily trend over the <u>last 30 days</u>.

- Thirteen (13) ERCs had APOT times greater than thirty (30) minutes.
- Seven (7) ERCs had APOT times greater than sixty (60) minutes.



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





MOBILE FIELD HOSPITALS

- MFHs are capable of expanding current hospital capacity by adding additional patient beds.
- They are large heavy duty canvas tents with hard flooring and temperature controlled units.
- They can be configured in a myriad of footprints and sizes (i.e. 25-200 bed).
- CDPH is primed and ready to provide hospitals a waiver to allow emergency use of this MFH facility.
- OCEMS is actively deploying multiple MFHs to OC hospitals prepared to receive & operate
 - o OCEMS has a total of 8 trailers to support at minimum, 200 patient beds.
 - Hospitals who have self-identified in receiving a MFH include:
 - UCI (50 bed) confirmed
 - Fountain Valley (50 bed) confirmed
 - Hoag Newport (50 bed) not confirmed
 - St. Joseph (25 bed) not confirmed
