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2	OCHCA Update	COVID Response
	- Dr. Grewal Report - Kevin Chao	 Decreasing case rates, nearing where we were a week ago, seems to be leveling off. Still significantly higher than a month ago. Positivity rate at 27.4%. Hospitalization seems to be leveling off, staying at about 1200 over last few days. Hoping to see a little bit of a decrease according to some models. Pediatric admission as a percentage are higher than traditionally, at around 8%. Omnicom is most dominate variant. Low influenza case rates only 7 needing to be hospitalized last week. Nearly no diversion times because it is suspended currently. Not planning to lift until case rates lower APOTs tend to be around 40 minutes, also flattening out. Seeing less ERCs with delays in extended APOTs. Staffing program is still in place, some facilities ask for staff but decline prior to signing MOU EOC is still busy supporting vaccination pods No more Bia Nix now, giving allocation to SNFs for visitors only. Have a few Care Start antigen test. Received a supply of iHealth tests, only received 11,000 for all Orange County healthcare workers. Notified yesterday from State that we will be receiving allocation for test kits, unsure of quantity. No updates on monoclonal antibodies, currently only Sotrovimab is effective on omicron variant. Very limited supply UCI has over 20 patients unable to discharge or send to SNFs, really clogging up patient flow. Dr. Grewal mentioned to state but not yet received a response.
