I. CALL TO ORDER

• The meeting was called to order by Mike De Laby at 9:03 a.m.

EMS Health Emergency Management Report

- The first planning meeting for the spring exercise will be on February 3, 2020 at 10:00am at the HCA AOC.
- Eye on Influenza There has been a significant increase on influenza activity. There has also been one reported case of the coronavirus. We will reach out to you electronically with any further updates or if anything changes. Coronavirus updates will be provided as EMS receives them from HCA Epidemiology, who is in constant contact with CDC.
- MCI/HavBed/Census/Hear Reports have been posted on our website.
- Diversion Reports have been posted on our website.

V. OLD BUSINESS

- 2019/2020 Hospital Advisory Committee Goals Goal #1: Ensure each facility has a COOP or (outline) collaboratively designed by the end of 2019. HCA will check in with each facility periodically to track and confirm completion. Goal #2: Establish a network with surrounding coalition members. Nicola Harwood will share the City of Orange Network documents and process with the committee. Developed networks will maintain minutes and sign in sheets as documentation.
- **2019 Hazard Vulnerability Assessment –** Nine facilities did not participate. The information is based on the facilities that did participate. Mike De Laby will resend out the document.
- Hospital PIO Training This was distributed to the hospital PIOs and is an HCA sponsored event.
- **PPE Distribution** Back in 2018, PPE was ordered for the hospitals but was never distributed. We resurveyed the hospitals on quantity and the hospitals that responded will get distribution of the PPE in March. We will let you know when we get the delivery schedule finalized. Mike De Laby will contact volunteers from CHOC, St Joe, UCI and Camp Pendleton to establish a working group to address PPE training
- Disaster Assets (Decon/Disaster/MODS Trailers) We have five ambulance disaster trailers, ten decontamination trailers and two mobile oxygen dispensing systems. The assets have not had maintenance in some time. The next step will be finding vendors to give us a quote on maintenance to determine what that will

look like. Another suggestion that we plan and intend on funding was a solar panel that sits on the asset that keeps the battery charged so they are charged and functional all the time.

- EMS Health EM Recruitment We currently have one PH Nurse, two HEM Program Supervisors, one Staff Specialist, and one Office Assistant positions vacant. Mike De Laby will be the contact for HPP as Danielle Ogaz transitions over to EMS Systems and Standards Chief position. Alison Kellman will remain the interim HCC Coordinator for now.
- Hospital Conex Inventory We have found that there are two inventories in the Conex containers for most hospitals and some may have three. One of the inventory lists is what is on the MOU, the other list is the list of things that exist in eight cages. The third list is the list that exists only for trauma hospitals (3) that consists of a trauma/burn cache. EMS will inventory the cages and the trauma lists, five hospitals at a time, pull out the expired items, re-standardize it and push it back out.

VI. <u>NEW BUSINESS</u>

- **Decontamination Trailer Demonstration** John Greer suggested one facility being a site for everyone to visit while an expert comes and shows everyone the correct operation and maintenance of the trailer. Mike De Laby will look for a vendor to do this demonstration. John Greer_volunteered Mission Hospital to be the host site.
- Major Incident Information Flow/Algorithm back to HICC Discussion only
- Submission Dates for 2020 If you have funding requests send them to Mike De Laby by February 28th.
 Other funding requests, send them in and he will see what he can do. Send education requests in by March 20th. Send in MOU inventory reports by April 1st. Please send in your updated HVA by July 31st.
- System Policy/Procedures and MOUs MOUs are due in 2020. Mike has a rough draft that he will circulate internally then he will push out to the group.
- HCC Surge Estimator Tool All of the hospitals met the deadline, however the tool is broken. Once we receive a new tool we will try and use the data we received from you before.
- HDMT Training Deadline Each hospital can send two people. The deadline is January 31, 2020. The class will be held in Los Angeles.
