With the exception of two projects that completed services on June 30, 2014, all remaining projects completed services on December 31, 2015.

Overview

Overarching Question

Can a well-trained consumer or family member be an effective paraprofessional in all clinical settings?

Overarching Innovative Component

Peer Support services were provided in all programs

Collective Solutions

Collective Solutions provided counseling and supportive services to family members struggling to cope with or manage a loved one's symptoms of mental illness or co-occurring substance use disorder.

Additional Innovative Component:

• Therapy and peer support services directly targeted family members

Goals:

- Increase family's community support network
- Increase family's resilience, coping skills, and ability to manage crisis situations related to mental illness

Project Life Coach

PLC provided comprehensive life-coaching and supportive employment services to individuals with mental illness struggling to obtain employment, specifically individuals within the unserved and underserved monolingual or limited English proficiency communities in Orange County.

Additional Innovative Component:

 Collaborations between ethnic-based service providers, behavioral health clinicians, and local ethnic community businesses

Goal:

 Assist individuals living with mental illness find employment and access to community resources for the purpose of facilitating healthy acculturation

Brighter Futures

Brighter Futures provided community-based counseling and peer supportive services to families with children ages 6 to 13 who experienced social, emotional, and behavioral health problems.

Additional Innovative Component:

Served children ages 6-13 who were not eligible for other available services

Goals:

- Increase access to behavioral health care among ethnic communities
- Improve family functioning, increase resilience, reduce isolation, and assist families in building support networks

OC ACCEPT

OC ACCEPT provides LGBTIQ-specific mental health services to address behavioral health issues disproportionately faced by the LGBTIQ community

Additional Innovative Component:

LGBTIQ-specific behavioral health services

Goals:

- Provide a safe environment to express feelings, build resilience, become empowered, and connect with others for support
- Provide trainings on LGBTIQ specific topics to raise awareness, reduce stigma, and educate the community

Integrated Community Services

ICS is a collaboration between County Behavioral Health services and community medical clinics that provides access to integrated medical and mental health services to County and community participants

Additional Innovative Component:

 Integration of medical and mental health services for County and community participants

Goal:

• Fully integrate participants' physical and mental health care needs
