2	NDMS Community Brief - Mike Doggett	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Naval Medical Forces Pacific <ul style="list-style-type: none"> o The purpose of the NDMS is to support State, local, Tribal and Territorial authorities following disasters and emergencies by supplementing health and medical systems and response capabilities. - How it works



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		<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ A major disaster OUTSIDE of your local jurisdiction has overwhelmed their local medical capabilities or there are too many battle casualties for military/VA hospitals ○ HHS/DoD/VA alerts Federal Coordinating Centers and the FCC collects available bed reports ○ USAF TRANSCOM regulates pts to the Patient Reception Area ○ Pt's transported by Plane, Ambulance, water borne asset ○ FCC coordinates distribution and facilitates tracking locally. ○ The FCC and County EMS assign patients to civilian hospitals according to the bed report ○ Transportation assets are staged at the Patient Reception Site (PRS) ○ Patients arrive at PRS and are transferred directly to the treatment facility ○ Patient updates are provided daily to the FCC/HHS ○ Upon discharge from the hospital, HHS will arrange follow-on care & transportation back to home. - Compensation <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ Patient's medical insurer ○ Medicare –110% current rate (possible 120% next year) ○ TRICARE ○ NDMS–covers all other payments <ul style="list-style-type: none"> •Charges for activation of the PRS (Food, water, misc.) •Document /Document /DOCUMENT!!!! •Overtime is not usually compensated in the care facility - Expectations of Member Facilities <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ Abide by the MOA provided by HHS and signed by the FCC and you ○ Bi-monthly bed reporting drills & other NDMS training

Seeing current staffing issues and patient volumes went down. - Rise in behavioral health and longer bedtimes in ED affecting ED capabilities. - Please make sure hospital status reflects whole hospital not just ED status.



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		<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Please be accurate in reporting beds staffed and available. - For facilities that are not responsive administration gets contacted. <p>Long-acting antibody pills being distributed to hospitals in Orange County, last up to 12 months. State determined 6 hospitals to receive. For extremely immunocompromised, usually Organ Transplant patients.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - St. Jude - Fountain Valley - Mission - UCI - St. Joes - CHOC
