Minutes

I. CALL TO ORDER

- Kevin Chao called the meeting to order at 9:00 a.m.

II. INTRODUCTIONS/ANNOUNCEMENTS

- Attendance information obtained from roll call and Zoom participant report

III. APPROVAL OF MINUTES

- The December 8, 2021 minutes were approved

IV. EMS/HEM REPORT

- COVID-19 positivity case rates are down to 3%; hospitalizations are down as well
- SNF/LTC outbreaks are down to 7 SNF and 2 LTC
- The predominant strain is Omicron, representing 99% of the cases
- The new BA2 variant of Omicron has not been causing much of a problem; however, it's more infectious than the BA1 variant and so far, represents approx. 16% of cases nationwide
- Influenza is mild and sporadic this year, though there is a slight uptick; in OC, we have four people hospitalized and 1 in the ICU
- The AOC is still activated, supporting logistics for Mobile POD vaccinations; the process is winding down
- The AOC is also activated to support resource requests for needed supplies. However, keep in mind that because supply chains have opened considerably when submitting a request, you are required to provide proof that you have reached out to your usual supply chains and the items are out of stock. Also, understand that if you have difficulty obtaining certain supplies, so do we.
- The State concluded its 30-day PPE supply initiative at the end of February, and we are no longer accepting those resource requests
- We have BinaxNOW test kits available for SNF/LTC facilities allocated for visitors (3 test per bed). You can reach out to us for those kits. The team has contacted various SNF/LTC, but you can request more
- We also have over the counter iHealth test kits available. This allocation was specifically for healthcare workers to return to work after being isolated for COVID-19; but per the direction of the state, we can distribute and give a supply for workers and visitors. Please reach out to us
- We are filling two positions to help us on various projects, exercises, and drills; we will have people to support the operation
- Eddie Morales is doing an inventory of disaster connex containers at the hospitals. Hospitals are a hub in a disaster, supporting them to make sure we have adequate supplies geographically dispersed in the county
- We verified the current contact list for Hospice Home Health reaching out to facilities that are not coalition members, and they did not know there was an HCCOC. Kevin will work with the chairs/leads of each committee to make sure we are reaching out
- We have finalized an agreement with facilitator Hal Kempfer, a subject matter expert in disaster & emergency preparedness. We are working on a training calendar, and once it's complete, we will share it with the coalition members. Training will be free, virtually or in person

We hope to have a direct purchasing agreement to meet the 45-day surge supply of PPE requirement by January 2023. Then, in the meeting in June, we will announce the manufacturer.
