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# **Animal Care Program**

Animal Care is a new program within the Animal Health and Food Safety Services division of the California Department of Food and Agriculture.

#### Animal Care implements:

- 1. California Health and Safety Code (Prop 12) HSC §§ 25990-25994
- 2. California Code of Regulations





# Prop 12 (2018)



Ballot Initiative passed by California voters in 2018 (63% YES)

Two categories of prohibited activities:
Confinement of Animals in California
Egg-laying hens, breeding pigs, and veal calves

Sale of Covered Products in California HSC section 25990(b)

(b) A business owner or operator shall not knowingly engage in the sale within the state of any of the tollowing the color of the sale within the state of any of the tollowing the sale within the state of any of the tollowing the sale within the state of a covered animal who was conflied in a cruel manner.

(2) Whole pork meat that the business owner or operator knows or should know is the meat of a covered animal who was conflied in a cruel manner, or is the meat of immediate offspring of a covered animal who was conflied in a cruel manner.

(3) Shell egg that the business owner or operator knows or should know is the product of a covered animal who was conflied in a cruel manner.

(4) Liquid eggs that the business owner or operator knows or should know are the product of a covered animal who was confined in a cruel manner.

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# **Animal Confinement Regulations**



California Code of Regulations


Finalized and went into effect September 1, 2022


Regulatory framework for implementing Prop 12 to ensure covered products sold in California are compliant with covered animal confinement standards.


Modeled after USDA's National Organic Program regulatory framework.



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# Commercial Sale (1 of 3) "Commercial sale" means to sell, exchange, barter, trade, transfer title or possession, or distribute, conditional or otherwise, in California commerce including, but not limited to, transactions by a retailer with a consumer and electronic transactions made using the internet. # Commercial Sale (2 of 3)



It shall **not** include any of the following transactions or transfers of possession, which apply only to a specific transaction listed below, not to the covered product itself, and **therefore does not apply to all subsequent commercial sales of covered product**:

- Any sale of shell eggs or liquid eggs undertaken on the premises of an official plant at which mandatory inspection is provided under the federal Egg Products Inspection Act (21 U.S.C. Sec. 1031 et seq.) and that holds an establishment number (prefix "G") granted by the Food Safety Inspection Service of the United States Department of Agriculture
- Any sale of whole pork/veal meat undertaken on the premises of an establishment at which mandatory inspection is provided under the Federal Meat Inspection Act (21 U.S.C. Sec. 601 et seq.) and that holds an establishment number (prefix "M") granted by the Food Safety Inspection Service of the United States Department of Agriculture

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# Commercial Sale (3 of 3)



It shall **not** include any of the following transactions or transfers of possession, which apply only to a specific transaction listed below, not to the covered product itself, and **therefore does not apply to all subsequent commercial sales of covered product:** 

- Covered product produced outside of the state that enters and exits California, without additional processing or repackaging, exclusively for purposes of transshipment or export outside of the state
- Any sale that is made directly to federal agencies or that takes place on federal lands located within the state
- Any sale of covered product which takes place on tribal lands located within the state
- Donations to nonprofit organizations that have a tax exemption under section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code (26 U.S.C.)

#### SHELL EGGS

Hard cooked

#### LIQUID EGGS

Pasteurized and Liquiunpasteurized frozen

Liquid, dried, frozen, separated into whites and yolks

Only added preservatives, stabilizers, flavoring Cooked egg pucks

#### WHOLE VEAL MEAT

#### EAL WHOLE PORK MEAT

Uncooked cuts of meat (excluding ground)

Does not include RTE products

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# Shell Eggs



"Shell egg" means a whole egg of an egg-laying hen in its shell form, intended for use as human food.

"In its shell form" means an egg as developed, proportioned and shaped in the shell by an egg-laying hen, whether it is in the shell, raw, pasteurized in the shell, treated in the shell, hardboiled, or otherwise cooked in whole form, peeled, co-packaged with other foods, or subsequently sold sliced, chopped, or otherwise cut.





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# Liquid Eggs




"Liquid eggs" means the product defined in section 25991(I) of the Health and Safety Code intended for use as human food, whether it is raw or pasteurized, co-packaged with other foods, or sold frozen, dried, freeze-dried, or as a cooked patty, puck, or other cooked form, and shall include all of the following:

- Liquid eggs, dried eggs, frozen eggs, egg whites, dried egg whites, frozen egg whites egg yolks, dried egg yolks, frozen egg yolks.

  Any mixture, irrespective of proportions, of two or more of the products specified in this subsection.
- Any product, or mixture of products, specified in this subsection to which has been added no more than sugar, salt, water, seasoning, coloring, flavoring, preservatives, stabilizers, or other similar food additives.
- Any product represented to the customer as, or bearing the statement of identity of, liquid eggs, or any of the products specified in this subsection on the product label according to section 101.3 of Title 21 of the Code of Federal Regulations (April 2021).

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"Whole pork meat" means any uncooked cut of pork, including bacon, ham, chop, ribs, riblet, loin, shank, leg, roast, brisket, steak, sirloin, or cutlet, that is comprised entirely of pork meat, except for seasoning, curing agents, coloring, flavoring, preservatives, and similar meat additives.

Whole pork meat does not include combination food products, including soups, sandwiches, pizzas, hotdogs, or similar processed or prepared food products, that are comprised of more than pork meat, seasoning, curing agents, coloring, flavoring, preservatives, and similar meat additives.

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## **Meat Definition**



#### HSC 25991

"Pork meat" means meat, as defined in Section 900 of Title 3 of the California Code of Regulations as of August 2017, of a pig of the porcine species, intended for use as human food.

#### 3 CCR 900

"Meat" means the part of the muscle of any cattle, sheep, swine, goats or fallow deer that is skeletal or that is found in the tongue, in the diaphragm, in the heart, or in the esophagus, with or without the accompanying and overlying fat, and the portions of bone, skin, sinew, nerve, and blood vessels that normally accompany the muscle tissue and that are not separated from it in the process of dressing. It does not include the muscle found in the lips, snout, or ears.

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## **Cut Definition**



"Cut" means any uncooked primal, wholesale, subprimal or retail cut including, but not limited to, those identified and described in the United States Department of Agriculture's Institutional Meat Purchase Specifications: Fresh Pork Series 400 (November 2014 Edition) and the 2014 Uniform Retail Meat Identity Standards developed by the Industry-Wide Cooperative Meat Identification Standards Committee but shall exclude any ground or otherwise comminuted meat products.

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# Specific statement required on all documents of title and shipping documents accompanying covered product transported into and within California: - "Egg CA Prop 12 Compliant" - "Veal CA Prop 12 Compliant" - "Pork CA Prop 12 Compliant" When receiving a shipment of covered product, appropriate statement is required to be on all documents of title and shipping documents. Other statements where covered product is not intended for use in California: "For Export", "For Transshipment", "Not Prop 12 Compliant". No product labelling specific to Prop 12 required

Individual reful locations are not required to register with CDFA. If the retailer purchases covered product directly from a facility with mandatory inspection under the Federal Meat Inspection Act or Egg Products Inspection Act and the facility is not a registered distributor, then the retailer is required to maintain records documenting written certifications of compliance for the covered product sold at that location.

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# Registered Distributors

## As Retailer or Food Processing Facility that is an End-User



And purchasing covered products directly from a facility under mandatory And purchasing covered products directly from a facility under mandatory FSIS inspection (ex. breaking plant for eggs, slaughter or fabrication plant for meat) that has not voluntarily registered as a distributor, shall:

Maintain records documenting written certifications covered product received during the preceding 12-month period.

- Maintain records documenting the address of the location where the retailer or food processor, as the buyer, takes physical possession of covered product for each sales transaction.
- Make these required records available on-site for inspection by the CDFA upon request. Electronic records are considered on-site if they are accessible from an on-site location.

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# If you are a retail chain with multiple retail locations:



- Register your internal warehouse distribution centers
- Definition of a distributor: a person or facility engaged in the business of commercial sales or distribution of covered product (as a producer or otherwise) to an end-user in California. This definition shall not apply to a person or facility that only receives covered product as an end-user.



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
