I. CALL TO ORDER

The meeting was called to order by Dr. Robert Katzer at 1:00 p.m.

III. APPROVAL OF MINUTES

Minutes from the July 10, 2024, meeting was approved as submitted.

IV. OCEMS REPORT

• Medical Director's Report - Dr. Carl Schultz

The Triage to Alternate Destination Plan policy is still moving forward. Most of the policies are in draft form but they need further refinement. The next step is to reach out to two individual entities that might be willing participant. One would be the CSU and the other would be a paramedic 911 provider. We would pick a single entity both on the receiving end and on the provider end to try and work this through before expanding it out to the entire county.

We have been monitoring the heat and the fires and looking at the 911 calls that are heat related. We had a substantial spike in 911 calls for heat related emergencies. We passed that information on to Public Health and the Heat Annex was activated. We are monitoring the air quality twice a day through our Health Disaster Preparedness program and they are reporting to Public Health.

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• Health Disaster Preparedness Report – Dr. Gagandeep Grewal

We have a few personnel at the CHA disaster conference. We are able to sponsor people through the
grants to go that conference, for future reference. We are awaiting final word on grant requirements for
the next grant cycle, but we understand there is a plan to emphasize cyber security in disaster. We are
working on making various trainings available.

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Ambulance Patient Off-Load Time – Dr. Gagandeep Grewal

Over the last several months, APOT and Diversion have essentially been flat. Times have been lower than they were over the last previous year and a half or two. For the month of August, our total APOT was 28 minutes and four seconds, which is below our 30-minute benchmark. It is notable that ambulance transports are up. APOTs are down, but ambulance transports are higher than they have been. Yesterday was the highest number of 911 transports we have ever seen at 607. Our diversion times are fairly flat and stable. There were only six hospitals that exceeded the 6% benchmark. As a whole, we are under that benchmark at 5%.

• Bi-Directional Data Exchange Project - Dr. Gagandeep Grewal

We have 21 of 24 ERCs onboarded. We are actively working with Anaheim Regional to make them our 22nd hospital. We have 12 EMS providers participating and will be adding Orange City and Orange County Sheriff Air Rescue on October 1st. 80% of 911 transports are going through this exchange on a daily basis. We are the first in the state to do this.

V. UNFINISHED BUSINESS

Follow-up on Obtaining Patient Temperatures in the Field - Dr. Carl Schultz

This was triggered by the alternate destination process. The CSUs require the patients being sent to them be afebrile. That is one of their exclusions. If the patient has a fever they will not accept them. Their facility is one large room and you cannot isolate somebody. We thought it would be a good idea for the paramedics to take the temps before transporting them to the CSUs. This will also work on sepsis appearing patients. The EMS Advisory Group was supportive. This will only apply to Anaheim in the beginning if they agree to participate.

Base Hospital Coordinators

The MICN class just finished and we will be reaching out to our local agencies to scheduling ride alongs. We have noticed there has been a trend in not medicating multi-system trauma patients. There is a No Fear conference that Hoag will be hosting on November 15th. We are asking any EMS agency to donate baskets for the raffle.
