




It May Contain Lead!</p> <p>Lead is dangerous for everyone, especially for children under 6 years of age.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Lead is in some traditional pottery. Lead can cause serious health problems. If you use traditional pottery: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Lead is for lead. You can't get lead out like at hardware stores. Even if the best chance that your pottery does not have lead, best option is to buy new, clean, chipless, or cracked. If it has lead or you don't know, do not use it for cooking, eating or storing food and drink. Use it only for decoration. A child with lead poisoning may not look or act sick. 13	<h2>Is There Lead in or Around Your Home?</h2> <p>Multiple Sources of Lead:</p> <p>Is there Lead In or Around Your Home?</p> <p>You cannot see lead, but it may be in many places inside and outside your home. Lead is dangerous and can be harmful, especially to children. Lead poisoning happens when lead is swallowed or breathed in. Most children who have lead poisoning do not look or act sick.</p> <p>Lead can be found:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> in old, chipped paint in traditional makeup like folk paints or cosmetics in house dust in remedies like camels, gums, or herbal teas in soil in water in toys and objects in food and drink in personal care products in medicines in jewelry in cars in gardens in pets in neighbors in the environment <p>NEW</p>	Eng / Spn					
14	<h2>Lead In Tap Water (Bilingual)</h2> <p>LEAD IN TAP WATER</p> <p>A FACT SHEET FOR CALIFORNIA</p> <p>In California, lead in tap water is a risk for drinking, bathing, and brushing teeth.</p> <p>Lead is a dangerous metal that can harm your child's brain, nerves, and behavior. Lead is also a major cause of high blood pressure, kidney disease, and other health problems. Lead is especially dangerous for children because their brains and nerves are still developing.</p> <p>How to protect your child from lead in tap water:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Use bottled water for drinking and cooking. Use filtered water for drinking and cooking. Use cold water for drinking and cooking. Let the tap water run for a few minutes before using it. Use a lead-free faucet aerator. 
