I. CALL TO ORDER

• The meeting was called to order by Whiteny Patnode at 1:06 p.m.

II. <u>INTRODUCTIONS/ANNOUNCEMENTS</u>

- Everyone went around the room and introduced themselves.
- John Black was introduced as the new Sr. Emergency Management Coordinator for EMS/HDP.
- CHOC's name is changing to Rady's Children Hospital Orange County effective Friday, September 12th.

III. APPROVAL OF MINUTES

Minutes from the July 9, 2025, meeting were approved.

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IV. OCEMS REPORT

- Medical Director's Report Dr. Gagandeep Grewal
 - We are working on updating some policies. We were doing a pilot of using a lower dose of ketamine in the field strictly for pain control, not sedation, and we plan to expand this to the become a standing ALS order for the system. We are waiting for legal support from HCA. There was an alternate discussion on dosage for agitated patients.
 - The recommended dose was a single dose of 10mg for adults.
 - It was also recommended that slow IV push, rather than a slow IV infusion, be the preferred route, with the intent to make the injection practical but still avoid dissociative side effects.
 - Mike Noone met a patient advocate, Jessica Sella, for patients with Addison's Disease and other adrenal issues. Her son attends Chapman University and carries a small kit with injectable steroids. How can we get our paramedics comfortable assisting a patient who is carrying their own steroid for adrenal crisis?
 - Base hospitals would recommend telling paramedic/EMT not to administer until at the hospital if they don't feel comfortable.
 - Others commented that there are numerous rare conditions in the community, and it is rarer still to need to respond to and treat these conditions. It would be burdensome for the EMS system to have all EMS providers learn about all of these rare conditions and their treatment.
 - A suggestion was made about having methylprednisolone on the ambulances as it is
 easier to administer and will have some effect on Addison's Crisis. Dr Schlesinger also
 pointed out that steroids are being used for asthma in some EMS systems.
 - Triage to Alternate Destination project We are working on finalizing funding to begin the pilot with Anaheim Fire and the Santa Ana CSU.
- Health Disaster Preparedness Report Dr. Gagandeep Grewal
 - We had the HICS training on August 7th here at the AOC. We also had the two-day Health Disaster Management Training (HDMT) training on August 20th and 21st. Both were a great success and there was positive feedback from the attendees.
- Ambulance Patient Off-Load Time Jason Azuma
 - APOT in August was a little busier than July. We had 547 transports a day for just under 17,000 transports for the month of August. We did stay well below our 30 min benchmark, with a 90th % of 23:32.
 - All AB40 requirements are supported in the current OC-MEDS PCRS standards. However, it was brought to our attention that it is not obvious. We are looking to modify our Run Form to help make sure that everything is being documented.
 - o Diversion went up in August. We were over 1,000 hours as a system at 5.7%, which is below our informal standard of 6%.

- Possible updates for SO-C-40, SO-P-35, and SO-M-35 Dr. Gagandeep Grewal
 - Added lidocaine to SO-C-40 for another option for wide complex tachycardia with a pulse.

 Justin Horner reported that they continue to work on recommended updates for SO-C-10 and looking at
 pediatric airway options. The base coordinators are looking at SO-AMA language and update to standing
 order.

 Met yesterday and discussed motion for upcoming designation for Kaiser Irvine.
- Pediatric Collaborative Have not met since June.
